Directorate of Planning, Statistics and Evaluation (DPSE) since 1975-76.

The present edition is the 35th in the series and incorporates data related to

rural wages prevalent in the State of Goa during the agricultural year 2017-

18 (July to June) for various agricultural and non-agricultural activities.

The data is presented taluka-wise and operation-wise and indicates the

wage trends during the year 2017-18, both for male and female workers.

This brochure will serve as a useful tool in the study of wage patterns

prevailing in the State.

The information is collected from four selected sample villages of each

taluka of the State for different occupations. The field work is carried out

by Village level Revenue Staff and the Block level Statistical Assistants of

this Directorate who constitute the Primary Reporting Agency.

It is the endeavor of this Directorate to reduce the time lag in releasing the

results at the earliest. The limitation of the data presented in this report is

that the wages reported in the four selected villages of each taluka represent

the respective taluka.

Suggestions for improvement in the content and quality of this publication

are most welcome.

INTRODUCTION

Rural wages data has vital significance in terms of planned development of agricultural/rural sectors engaged in various related operations, skilled or unskilled. This data is also essential for carrying out cost of cultivation studies for studying the economic pattern of different crops, given the fact that Agriculture is one of the primary and important activities of the State, and the agriculture sector contributes nearly 9 % of the State's income. People residing mainly in the rural parts of Goa thrive on agricultural activities such as crop cultivation, plantation, ploughing, transplanting, harvesting, irrigating, manuring, threshing, weeding, green manuring, tilling etc. for earning their daily livelihood. Non-agricultural activities comprise toddy tapping, coconut plucking, arecanut and cashew harvesting, carpentry, masonry, pottery, laundry, bamboo and cane weaving, cattle grazing, stone cutting/hewing, casual labour etc.

Minimum wage is the pillar of Human Development Index and availability of reliable information on wages as well as a study of the prevailing rural wages is all the more necessary for the purpose of effective enforcement of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948. This Act provides the basis for fixation and periodical revision of minimum wage rates in agriculture and other employments in the unorganized sector in the rural areas, with the aim of up-lifting the poor and marginal sections of the society. As per the Act, eight hours of work per day constitutes a normal working day and the same rates of wages are to be paid to male and female casual labourers for the same and similar type of work done.

In view of the above, the Directorate of Planning, Statistics and Evaluation

has been collecting and compiling data on rural wages based on a survey of 4 villages selected from each of the 12 Talukas in the State and bringing out a report annually in terms of spatial and temporal variations covering agricultural and some of the rural based non-agricultural operations.

A) Scope and Coverage

The State of Goa is divided into 2 districts viz. North Goa district and South Goa district comprising of 12 talukas. Five talukas constitute the North Goa district and seven talukas form the South Goa district. Data on rural wages presented in this report is collected from 4 sample villages from each of the 12 talukas.

The data is scrutinized, compiled and the results are presented in this report. District/taluka-wise and operation-wise data on average daily wages, separately for adult male and female workers is presented for various agricultural and non-agricultural operations, for the agricultural year July 2017 to June 2018. The list of the selected 48 villages from the 12 talukas is given in *Annexure I*.

Table No. I presents the taluka-wise data on average daily wages of agricultural labourers engaged in activities affiliated to cultivation of field crops. Table III presents similar data for plantation crops such as coconut, areca-nut, cashew-nut etc. Tables II, IV and VI present district-wise distribution of average daily wages for agricultural labourers engaged in field crop activities, plantation activities, skilled and unskilled non-agricultural activities

Table No. V represents the average daily wages of skilled workers mainly comprising artisans like blacksmiths, bamboo and cane workers, carpenters, masons, potters, stone cutters etc. and unskilled workers such as cattle grazers/cowherds, casual labour etc. for the year 2017-18.

B) Wage Trends

I Agricultural Activities

(i) Field Crops

The taluka-wise and sex-wise distribution of average daily wages earned by labourers involved in field crop activities during the year 2017-18 are depicted in Table I. The study indicates that digging, ploughing, transplanting, irrigation, green manuring, weeding, paddy harvesting and threshing constitute the major activities under field crops.

As can be seen from Table No. I Sattari taluka in North Goa and Salcete taluka in South Goa accounted for the highest average wages for male labourers in most of the field crop activities while the wages earned in Pernem taluka were the least for most of the aforesaid activities. Whereas, in the case of female labourers, Mormugao and Sanguem taluka in South Goa accounted for the highest average wages while Sattari taluka in North Goa accounted for the lowest average wages paid to women.

Ploughing is the only activity which is man oriented and commanded average wages of ₹1114/- per day in Salcete taluka whereas in Pernem taluka, the daily wage for ploughing of fields was the lowest at ₹400/- followed by Bardez taluka at ₹463/-.

Activities like digging and transplanting earned the highest wages of ₹835/- on an average for men in Salcete taluka while the lowest average wage paid was ₹300/- for the work related to irrigation in all the talukas of South Goa.

The wages for female labourers for all field crop activities registered mixed trends ranging from a highest of ₹800/- in Mormugao taluka to ₹200/- being the lowest in Canacona taluka. Weeding earned them highest wages in Mormugao taluka, so

also women in Salcete and Sanguem taluka earned more for threshing at ₹500/- and ₹505/- respectively. The lowest average wage paid was ₹200/- for irrigation in Canacona taluka.

A standard rate of ₹300/-, ₹425/-, ₹525/- and ₹550/- prevailed in all the talukas of South Goa for the work related to irrigation, manuring, harvesting and threshing respectively in case of male labourers. While the wages ranged from a low of ₹200/- to ₹505/- for their counterparts in South Goa talukas for the same activities. Men earned highest wages of ₹1000/- and ₹750/-for weeding in Mormugao and Salcete talukas respectively in South Goa while they earned the least i.e. ₹367/- in Bardez taluka in North Goa for the same activity. Women earned highest wages of ₹800/- for weeding in Mormugao taluka of South Goa while they earned the least in Sattari in North Goa.

For other agricultural work, men earned highest wages of ₹800/-in Salcete taluka and the lowest average wage of ₹400/- in Pernem in North Goa.

It is seen that among all the talukas, Sattari has a standard average wage of ₹525/for men and ₹270/- for women for all kinds of field crops activities.

Table II displays the district-wise and sex-wise distribution of daily wages earned by agricultural labourers for various field crop activities. It is seen that the cost of male labour for field crop activities is higher in South Goa district than in North Goa district. Similarly, cost of female labour in South Goa district is higher than in North Goa district for the same activities.

At the State level, the average daily wages earned by male labourers involved in various field crop activities during the year 2017-18 was ₹537/-, the highest being for ploughing and the lowest being for irrigation and manuring. In respect of female labourers, the average daily wages earned amounted to ₹356/-, the highest

being for weeding and the lowest being for irrigation.

II Plantation Crops

Table No. III portrays the taluka-wise and district wise average wages earned by agricultural labourers, both men and women, engaged in plantation and related activities during the year 2017-18.

Plantation related activities comprises of digging of pits, plantation of crops, green manuring, irrigation, coconut and arecanut plucking/harvesting and gathering, other activities (like mango, banana and pineapple harvesting, pepper harvesting etc.), cashew apple and nut collection, cashew juice/nira extraction, toddy tapping, dehusking coconut and arecanut and other activities (like stacking/selling of coconut/arecanut husk, cutting and drying of copra etc.)

As can be seen from Table No. III, Mormugao, Quepem and Salcete talukas in South Goa accounted for daily average wage earnings in the range of ₹500/- to ₹1000/- for male labourers in most of the plantation activities whereas in Pernem taluka in North Goa district, barring coconut and arecanut harvesting, the average daily average wage earnings of male labourers were restricted to ₹400/- for any plantation activity.

Coconut plucking is one plantation activity which has commanded the best wages ranging from ₹1000/- to ₹1067/- for men in Bicholim, Pernem, Tiswadi, Canacona, Darbandora and Mormugao talukas. So also, arecanut harvesting earned handsome wages of ₹1000/- in Bicholim and Mormugao talukas and ₹1050/- in Darbandora taluka respectively. However, in Ponda taluka, the average wages paid both for coconut and arecanut harvesting was almost 50% less at ₹500/-.

In the case of female labourers, the average daily wages for all types of plantation activities ranged between ₹280/ and ₹500/-. The highest wages earned by female labourers were for digging of pits at ₹570/- in Salcete followed by Ponda taluka in South Goa district at ₹500/-. Sattari taluka in North Goa district had a standard wage rate of ₹280/- for plantation, green manuring and water irrigation activities.

Men in Salcete taluka and women in Quepem taluka of South Goa district engaged in cashew collection recorded highest wages of ₹900/- and ₹500/- respectively. Quepem taluka also recorded handsome wages paid to men for cashew juice/nira extraction at ₹950/- whereas Bardez taluka recorded the lowest wages at ₹500/- for the same activity. In the case of women, Sanguem taluka accounted for the best wages of ₹500/- and Darbandora and Salcete talukas paid the lowest wages of ₹300/- for cashew juice/nira extraction activity.

Mormugao taluka accounted for the highest wages paid to men for de-husking of coconut and arecanut at ₹1000/- whereas Pernem taluka earned the lowest daily wages for men at ₹400/- for the same job. Quepem taluka fetched the highest wages for women in de-husking of arecanut at ₹500/- followed by Sanguem taluka at ₹483/- for the twin activities of de-husking of coconut and arecanut. Pernem taluka, on the other hand recorded the lowest wages paid to women at ₹300/- for both the activities.

Table No. IV gives the district-wise and sex-wise distribution of average daily wages commanded by labourers engaged in plantation crops activities. It is seen from the table that South Goa district dominates the wage scene both for men as well as women labourers as far as plantation related work is concerned.

At the State level, the average daily wages earned by male and female labourers

involved in various plantation crop activities during the year 2017-18 were ₹633/ and ₹387/- respectively, the highest being for coconut harvesting and the lowest being for irrigation.

III Skilled and Unskilled Workers other than Agricultural labourers

Skilled Workers

Activities such as carpentry, blacksmithing, masonry, bamboo & cane weaving, pottery, weaving, stone cutting and other skilled labour such as cobbler/shoe repairs, grinding, sharpening of implements, sawing, painting etc. make up for some of the major non-agricultural activities requiring skilled labour.

Table No. V portrays the taluka-wise and sex-wise average wages of skilled workers in rural Goa for the year 2017-18. Amongst the skilled male workers engaged in non-agricultural operations, carpentry and masonry are the two occupations which are predominantly undertaken by men.

As far as skilled labour is concerned, the average daily wages for men ranged from ₹367/- to ₹1200/- and ₹295/- to ₹700/- for women.

Stone cutting commanded the highest daily wages of ₹1200/- in Mormugao taluka followed by carpentry at ₹1031/- whereas blacksmithing, weaving and other uncategorized skilled labour fetched wages of ₹1000/- each. The lowest wages were paid in Bardez taluka for other uncategorized skilled labour at ₹367/-. Women too, earned highest wages of ₹700/- for masonry and stone cutting work in Mormugao taluka in South Goa while the lowest wages earned by them were ₹295/- for bamboo and cane work in Pernem taluka.

A standard wage rate of ₹800/- and ₹656/- prevailed in Bicholim and Sattari talukas respectively in North Goa district for all work related to skilled male labour.

Bicholim taluka in North Goa district and Darbandora and Mormugao in South Goa district accounted for the highest wages for men engaged in skilled labour while Ponda taluka in South Goa recorded the least daily wages paid to men ranging from ₹400/- to ₹525/-. Similarly, Mormugao taluka in South Goa district turned out to be the highest payer of daily wages to women engaged in skilled labour. On the other hand, Pernem taluka in North Goa district paid the lowest wages to women earning their living from skilled labour activities.

At the State level, the average daily wages earned by male labourers involved in skilled labour activities during the year 2017-18 was ₹649/, the highest being for carpentry and the lowest being for pottery. While in the case of female labourers, the average daily wages earned amounted to ₹387/-, the highest being for masonry and the lowest being for weaving.

Unskilled Workers

Non-agricultural unskilled activities such as cattle grazing, washing of clothes and casual labour etc. are also considered for compilation of rural wages. The average daily wages for unskilled male workers engaged in unskilled labour for the year 2017-18 ranged from 363- to 750- for men while women earned anywhere between 217- to 500-.

Other unskilled activities and casual labour accounted for the highest wages of ₹750/- and ₹681/- per day for men in Salcete taluka respectively. However, women

earned the highest wages of ₹500/- in Bardez taluka for casual labour and ₹450/- for other unskilled activities in Salcete taluka. Cattle grazing fetched the lowest wages of ₹363/- for men in Sanguem taluka and ₹217/- for women in Salcete taluka in South Goa district.

At the State level, the average daily wages earned by labourers involved in unskilled labour activities during the year 2017-18 were ₹505/- for men and ₹350/- for women, the highest being for uncategorized i.e. other unskilled activities and the lowest being for cattle grazing for men whereas for women, the highest being for casual labour and other unskilled activities and the lowest being for washer man.

It can be summed up from the entire report that the average daily rural wages prevailing in South Goa district for all activities are higher than those in North Goa district except for unskilled activities in case of women, where the average wages are higher in North Goa than those earned in South Goa.
